Parkview Parent Survey: High Favorables		436 respondents
<b>Curriculum and Assessment</b>	<b>97.3%</b> reported that academic standards focus on important concepts in content. <b>92.7%</b> reported that testing offers students the chance to show what they know in a variety of ways.	
<b>Instruction</b>	<b>96.3%</b> reported that teaching practices promote active, hands on learning. <b>93.5%</b> reported that their child was challenged with appropriate levels of critical thinking skills.	
<b>Relationships</b>	<b>93.9%</b> reported that academic teams foster caring connections between teachers and students. <b>92.4%</b> reported that their child is accepted by his/her fellow students.
